SUPPORTING LOCAL EMERGING FARMERS

Shaw's Pass Emerging Farmers (SPEF), a co-op of 30 emerging farmers close to the Hemel en Aarde Road, is receiving support from Klipheuwel Wind Farm to help these farmers become sustainable and ultimately raise up to 1 000 pigs for the region's meat market.

Anthony Hess of SPEF: "With this funding, our group is motivated to organise purposefully and to grow our farming business into a sustainable enterprise that will make the surrounding black communities proud, and to act as role models and mentors for other emerging farmers."





Mandy Franse from Caledon is one of 17 students who have been funded by the Klipheuwel Wind Farm Bursary programme. She now has a BTech Tourism Management degree behind her name and is following her dream in the tourism field.

The bursary programme launched in 2016 and is open to ambitious youth in the Theewaterskloof Municipality communities of Genadendal, Caledon, Grabouw, Botriver and Hermanus. Bursary beneficiaries receive tuition fees, travel and accommodation costs, book allowances and even a stipend.

The wind farm keeps in touch with the bursary recipients, helping to motivate them to achieve their goals.



BOOSTING CREATIVITY IN GENADENDAL



The implementation of a Remedial Teacher and Arts, Crafts and Entrepreneurial Skills Teacher at L.R. Schmidt Primary School in Genadendal, has been a huge success according to the school's Principal, families and community members in general.

These two teaching posts, which were implemented in 2016, with funding made available by Klipheuwel Wind Farm, provides a stimulating and creative environment for many children who are not academically inclined.

Ms Heidi von Caeus, Arts, Crafts and Entrepreneurial Skills Teacher at L.R. Schmidt Primary School in Genadendal believes in each learners individual talents and abilities, saying, "I believe every child is born with a different set of abilities – we don't all excel academically, some are experts at using their hands, some at reading, some at analysis and so on. At our school we like to be able to cater for a variety of abilities."
